





**Comparison of GOI's Security Budgets:

 Since FY 2007, 22,366 have been re-settled in the United States.




GOI Oil Revenue^d




Unobligated Major U.S. Funds^e




Status of Ongoing Major Reconstruction Funds^e




Correlation of Provincial Council Seats to Ninewa's Ethnoreligious Composition, 2005 vs. 2009 Elections^f
